Why invest in Royce Capital Fund—Small-Cap Portfolio?

- Small-cap value fund (generally market caps up to \$3 billion) that focuses on companies with above-average profitability and low leverage that are selling at attractive valuations due to what Royce believes are temporary factors
- Pursues opportunities when expectations are low and focuses on industries where Royce sees the greatest number of compelling bargains
- Outperformed its benchmark, the Russell 2000 Index, in 76% of all monthly rolling 10-year periods for the 20 years ended 9/30/17

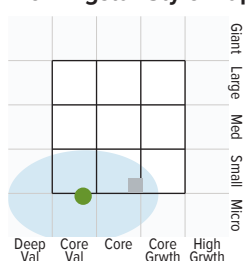

As of 6/30/17

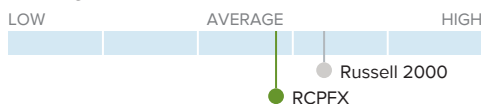

On a monthly rolling basis, the Fund outperformed the Russell 2000 in 76% of all 10-year periods; 69% of all 5-year periods; and 52% of all 1-year periods.

1. Royce classifies the Fund as 'Value' because it anticipates the portfolio will have a weighted average price-to-book ratio or weighted average normalized price to earnings ratio lower than the Russell 2000 Index. 2. **Geometric Average.** This weighted calculation uses each portfolio holding's market cap in a way designed to not skew the effect of very large or small holdings; instead, it aims to better identify the portfolio's center, which Royce believes offers a more accurate measure of average market cap than a simple mean or median. 3. **Average Volatility.** The Fund was in the middle volatility quintile compared with all funds in Morningstar's Insurance Fund Small Growth, Insurance Fund Small Blend, and Insurance Fund Small Value Categories with at least five years of history, a total of 112 funds as of 9/30/17. The universe consists of each fund's oldest share class only. Volatility quintiles are based on the average five-year standard deviation for each of the last four calendar quarters. Higher volatility is usually associated with higher risk. 4. **Active Share** is the sum of the absolute values of the different weightings of each holding in the Fund versus each holding in the benchmark, divided by two. 5. Mr. Kaplan has been the Fund's manager since 2003. 6. **Harmonic Average.** This weighted calculation evaluates a portfolio as if it were a single stock and measures it overall. It compares the total market value of the portfolio to the portfolio's share in the earnings or book value, as the case may be, of its underlying stocks. 7. The Fund's P/E Ratio calculation uses trailing 12-month earnings and excludes companies with zero or negative earnings (4% of portfolio holdings as of 9/30/17).

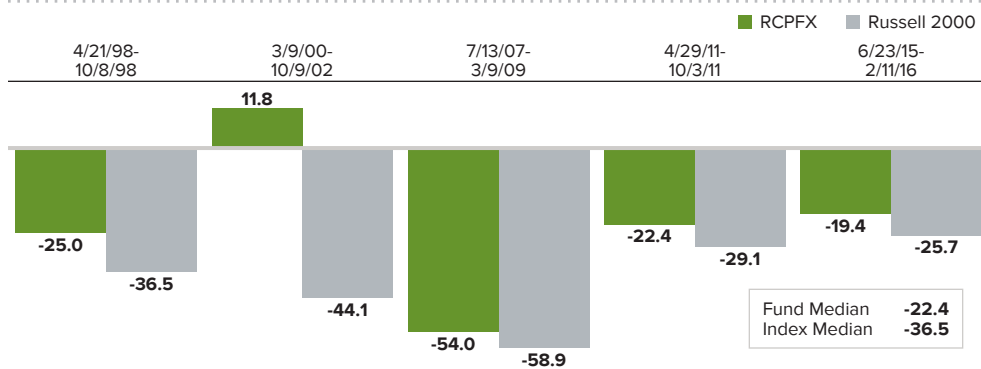

Down Market Performance Comparison (%)

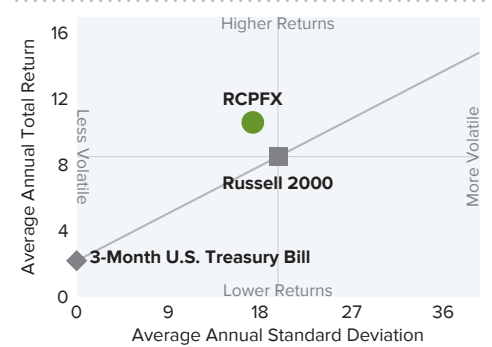
The Fund outperformed the Russell 2000 during all five downturns of 15% or more from the index's prior historical high since the Fund's inception.

Market Cycle¹ Performance (%)

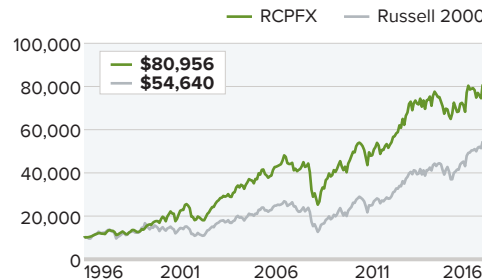

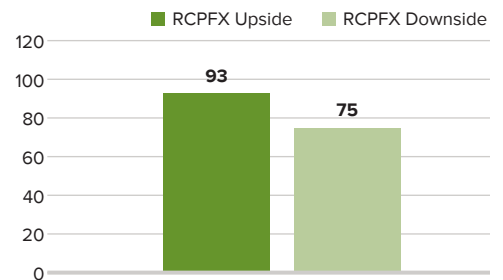
Value of \$10,000

The Morningstar Style Map uses proprietary scores of a stock's value and growth characteristics to determine its placement in one of the five categories listed on the horizontal axis. These characteristics are then compared to those of other stocks within the same market capitalization band. Each is scored from zero to 100 for both value and growth attributes. The value score is subtracted from the growth score to determine the overall style score. For the vertical, market cap axis, Morningstar subdivides into size groups. Giant-cap stocks are defined as those that account for the top 40% of the capitalization of each style zone; large-cap stocks represent the next 30%; mid-cap stocks the next 20%; small-cap stocks the next 7%; micro-cap stocks the smallest 3%. **Upside Capture Ratio** measures a manager's performance in up markets relative to the Fund's benchmark (Russell 2000). It is calculated by measuring the Fund's performance in quarters when the benchmark goes up and dividing it by the benchmark's return in those quarters. **Downside Capture Ratio** measures a manager's performance in down markets relative to the Fund's benchmark (Russell 2000). It is calculated by measuring the Fund's performance in quarters when the benchmark goes down and dividing it by the benchmark's return in those quarters. The **Price-Earnings**, or P/E, Ratio is calculated by dividing a company's share price by its trailing 12-month earnings-per-share (EPS). **The Price-to-Book**, or P/B, Ratio is calculated by dividing a company's share price by its book value per share. **Standard deviation** is a statistical measure within which a fund's total returns have varied over time.
